-review familiar program music-learn new page of All God's Creatures-learn new musical concept (ties)

Formative Assessment: constant ongoing evaluation of where the students are at while rehearsing new music

Summative Assessment: end of class questions to catch understanding of new musical concept

- 1. Prayer (3 min)
- 2. Work program music
 - a. Songs out of the book, quick runthrough (3 min)
 - i. Encourage as much memorization as possible
 - b. All God's Creatures (10 min)
 - i. Review what they already know (1st two verses)
 - ii. Learn new parts
 - 1. Play it on the piano, have them listen and then sing along
 - 2. Remind them which one is their part and which parts they don't sing
 - iii. Put familiar part together with new part
- 3. Learn new concept (9 min)
 - a. Ties
 - b. Have them sit, introduce the new concept
 - i. Explain what a tie is and what it's for
 - c. Answer any questions
 - d. Use All God's Creatures as an example have the students find ties in the music in both the vocal and piano lines
 - e. Ask a few summarizing questions to see if they understand
