# Grade Level: 4th Grade

<u>Concept/Curriculum/Goal Outcome:</u> Students will learn and become familiar with E on the recorder and be able to play a song with B, A, G, and E in it.

#### Lesson Outline

- I. Opening/Introduction
  - A. Get out recorders
  - B. Introduce the E fingering and note
  - C. Play warmups 1, 2, and 3 on page 12
- II. Presentation
  - A. Sing the song and have students echo
  - B. Sing through pitch names and have students represent each pitch with a different body percussion
  - C. Show students the song on the board and have them finger the notes on their recorders without playing
  - D. Divide students into four groups and have each group play one measure
  - E. Have the first two groups play the first two measures, the second group play the second two, and then switch
  - F. Have all students play the whole piece

### III. Exploration

- A. Present options for arrangement. Small groups? Unison? Split the class in half? Let them decide which order they want to perform the piece in.
- IV. Culmination/Closing
  - A. Play students' final arrangement
